WATER QUALITY: SAFE, TESTED, AND REGULATED

Your drinking water continues to meet or exceed all required health and safety standards.

Throughout the year, District operators:

- Conducted routine bacteriological and chemical sampling
- Monitored system pressure, flows, and performance daily
- Submitted all required reports to state regulatory agencies on time

Water Operator’s Reports are reviewed regularly by the Board and made publicly available on our website.

SYSTEM MAINTENANCE & RELIABILITY

Preventative maintenance remains one of the most important ways we protect reliability and control long-term costs.

This year, work included:

- Routine well and pump maintenance
- Valve exercising and system inspections
- Leak identification and timely repairs
- Well flow testing and system performance evaluations

This proactive approach helps reduce emergency outages and extends the life of District infrastructure.

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP & GOVERNANCE

Your District is committed to responsible financial management and transparent decision-making.

Throughout the year:

- The Board reviewed operational and financial reports at public meetings
- Staff managed resources carefully to support both daily operations and future needs
